

GCSE English Literature – Core Curriculum

Wales High School - Year 9 Subject Options

Subject Content - What will you be doing?

In English Literature you will study a range of poetry, prose and drama texts from the 19th century right through to the modern day. Themes such as love, jealousy, murder, ambition and fate ensure there is never a dull moment! The texts you will study will be chosen by your class teacher from a prescribed list set by the exam board. All of the texts will appear on one of two exams.

Paper 1:

Shakespeare: students will answer one question on a play studied in class. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play 'Macbeth' and then to write about the play as a whole.

The 19th **Century Novel:** students will answer one question on a novel studied in class. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel 'A Christmas Carol' and then to write about the novel as a whole.

Paper 2:

Modern Texts: students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on a modern prose or drama text studied in class, currently 'An Inspector Calls'.

Poetry: students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their poetry anthology, studied in class.

Unseen Poetry: students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing methods used in this poem with a second unseen poem.

Key Points about the Subject

- Paper 1 counts for 40% of the final English Literature grade.
- Paper 2 counts for 60% of the final English Literature grade.
- The exam is 'closed book' which means copies of texts cannot be taken into the exam.
- GCSE grades are reported on a scale of 1-9. The information above is subject to change and course content may change according to accreditation by the Department for Education.
- There will be a range of 'enrichment' opportunities available, including theatre visits and a residential trip to London.
